

## MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

We started our fiscal year off fully engulfed in all things COVID-19. Reduced capacities in our residential facilities to allow for quarantine rooms and more social distancing (in addition to single rooms for residents who were health compromised). Many visits with clients and their PPO occurred outside, which in some ways was a more relaxed setting to have an appointment. Our COVID precautions remained in effect until April 2021 when many staff and clients had the opportunity to be vaccinated and the positivity rates in our District had significantly declined.

In December, a local agency providing sex offender treatment in our community discontinued services, resulting in a significant and instant need to increase the sex offender treatment program services provided by our Department. We currently have two primary and two aftercare groups at our Sheldon office and two primary and four aftercare groups at our Sioux City office. We have four IBTSA certified staff (Iowa Board for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers) and seven staff working towards their certification.

I am super excited about our website (<u>www.thirddcs.com</u>) and the vast amount of organized information available there, especially the resource page.

I want to thank our Board for their guidance and support during the past year. I thank all of the community agencies that we work with to positively impact the lives of our clients. Most of all, I thank our staff for their passion and dedication to improving lives of those we work with and as a result, improving our communities.



#### STAFF TRAINING

Many of our staff are also trainers of specialized topics and facilitate training for the remainder of the Department. We are grateful for their skills and volunteering to be a trainer.

New Employee Orientation training for all new staff hired in the past year was completed in the fall. We taught and coached topics such as: Core Correctional Competencies, Personal Safety, Report Writing, Motivational Interviewing, CPR, Community Resources, and much more.

A concerted focus for training in FY 2021 was completion of the many and varied training modules offered through our statewide Learning Management System. Staff completed a total of **2,137** of training hours through LMS, which is nearly the total training hours completed last fiscal year. Our total training hours for this fiscal year, 4,326 is nearly double the training hours completed last fiscal year (2,791).










#### **CLIENTS SERVED ON SUPERVISION BY GENDER**







#### **CLIENTS ON SUPERVISION 6/30/2021 BY OFFENSE TYPE**




#### **CLIENTS ON SUPERVISION 6/30/2021 BY OFFENSE TYPE**




#### CLIENTS SERVED ON SUPERVISION THIS YEAR SUPERVISION BY TYPE AND RACE




#### **CLIENTS ON SUPERVISION 6/30/2021 BY AGE**



# SOUTH RTF CLIENT CHARGES FOR ALL 35 CLIENTS IN THE FACILITY ON JUNE 30, 2021








